REPORTS

Board of Trustees

- Trustee Mary Hornbuckle enjoyed CCC's scholarship night in Costa Mesa. She also attended and enjoyed the Coastline Visionary event.
- Trustee Jim Moreno attended the GWC police academy graduation and was honored to be a part of such a great program.
- Trustee Jerry Patterson requested a list of travel expenses for those spending more than \$10k per year be provided to the Board. Trustee Patterson said it was a pleasure to be at the ASOCC dinner. The students have learned a lot throughout the year and he is looking forward to the student dinners at CCC and GWC.
- Trustee Armando Ruiz commended the CCC Foundation and Student Government for supporting scholarships with over 25k in scholarship distributions.
- Student Trustee Jeri Elder attended both Coastline's scholarship and Visionary events. She reported a student trustee search is on; the screenings are scheduled for May 11 and the interviews will be held on May 25.

Chancellor

- Ken Yglesias, Chancellor, enjoyed attending the ASOCC dinner. He stated that Basic Skills is a big issue and CCCD will be working toward goals set during the accreditation process.

Members of the Student Advisory Council attended the statewide Student Senate Spring General Assembly where they had a great time and built strong relationships with fellow leaders from other community colleges. It was a very productive conference and they look forward to the fall general assembly. SAC members also attended the Coastline's 30th Anniversary Visionary Gala. They were both proud and happy to sponsor their founding president, Dr. Bernie Lusk.
- Brandon Shelly, ASGWC President, reported that ASGWC had its student council elections and all but two positions had been filled. The Council has decided to have a special election to fill these two positions since several students have now come forward and expressed an interest in filling the vacancies. Brandon reported that last week was Diversity Week, which was a huge success. He said there was still a great deal of student participation on campus in spite of the end-of-the semester. The ASGWC co-sponsored a Peace Conference event last week that about 90 people attended. Brandon recently attended the Student Senate of California Community Colleges General Spring Assembly, which he said was very informative. Attendees had the chance to vote on many constitutional amendments and resolutions saying it was a good learning experience. ASGWC's budget was just finalized and has been forwarded to the college president for review. The Finance commission is meeting this Thursday to discuss its Student Loan Program. Based on information Brandon received from the Student Senate Assembly, he was able to draft a proposal for a Textbook Rental Program.

Academic Senate Organizations
