Chancellor

New officers were installed at a dinner banquet on May 8, hosted by Student Advisory Council. Student Advisory Council (SAC) at CCC held e-waste collection on April 23. This was an opportunity for students, staff, and members of the community to recycle old electronics. Money raised was directed towards student identification cards. On April 26, members of the Student Advisory Council participated in the Huntington Beach clean-up.
