## REPORTS

### Board of Trustees

- Trustee Mary Hornbuckle reported that she attended GWC's production of "The Liar." Trustee Hornbuckle commended GWC for a job well done.
- Trustee Walt Howald said he has been to Sacramento several times this summer. Trustee Howald discussed the many campus tours with legislators including Assemblymembers Lynn Daucher and Chuck DeVore. Trustee Howald said Executive Director of the California Community College Foundation Larry Toy will visit on Friday, July 21.

### Chancellor

- Chancellor Ken Yglesias discussed the \$273.4 million AB1802 trailer bill that was approved by the legislature and signed by the governor. This bill amends current education code regarding funding for school districts.

### Presidents

- Ding-Jo Currie, CCC president, announced that CCC has completed a draft of the accreditation report. Currie announced that the annual Technical Institute for CCC faculty and staff will be held in August. Currie reported that the Contract Education department has worked hard to provide a Management & Supervisory Communication workshop in partnership with the Orange County One-Stop Center. This workshop is being offered to managers within the District and local businesses. The workshop will be held on August 10 at the Le-Jao Center.
- Wes Bryan, GWC president, announced GWC kicked-off its 40-year anniversary by being in the Huntington Beach Fourth of July parade. Bryan said the fifth edition of the E-Catalog is now online and registration begins this week. Faculty hiring is complete and Bryan thanked the Board of Trustees for their patience during the process of hiring new full-time faculty.
- Bob Dees, OCC president, announced the college received a plaque from the US Marine Corp. thanking them for training soldiers in electrical wiring. Many of those soldiers are now serving in Iraq.

### Employee Representative Groups

- Hillary Thomas, CFCE president, announced that negotiations are on-going and the classified contract is the only one not represented on the agenda for July. Thomas said they have met with employees to discuss the issues with negotiations. Thomas attended a leadership training institute and said it was energizing.
