REPORTS

Board of Trustees

- Board President Walt Howald commented on his presentation at ACCT and also congratulated RSCCCD trustee and GWC faculty member Brian Conley on his award. Howald announced that he was asked by the CC League to make a presentation on ethics at their annual convention.
- Trustee Jerry Patterson stated that he is happy that the Jet Blue flight landed safely and announced that he gave blood for the Red Cross and encouraged others to do the same. Patterson announced he attended the CCC's breakfast with the president and congratulated President Currie on her great presentation. Patterson reported he is looking forward to OCC's Constitution Day events. Patterson congratulated Brian Conley, RSCCCD trustee and GWC faculty member, on his ACCT award.
- Trustee George Brown stated he attended the GWC Police Academy graduation and congratulated the graduates on a successful year.
- Student Trustee Carlos Munoz announced the District Student Council meeting kick-off lunch on Sept. 23.

Chancellor

- Chancellor Ken Yglesias discussed his participation of the opening days at OCC and CCC. Yglesias announced that the District hosted Fred Harris from the State Chancellor's Office to discuss construction projects throughout the District.

Presidents

- Ding-Jo Currie, CCC president, announced that Friday will be the kick-off meeting for the accreditation. Currie also announced the One-Stop center is working with local businesses to assist with all the Katrina victims.
- Wes Bryan, GWC president, expressed holding a Welcome Back, All College Meeting on Sept. 22. Bryan announced GWC has 13,150 students this semester and invited everyone to attend A Night at the Races on Sept. 23 for scholarships. Bryan commented on their effort to raise \$10,000 for Katrina aid.
- Bob Dees, OCC president, commented on the success of Focus Day for their upcoming accreditation. Dees reported on the school's continuous efforts to help aid the victims of Katrina and announced a brunch will be held on Oct. 30 to help raise money.

Employee Representative Groups

- Dean Mancina, elected board, met for a lunch retreat at the Kellogg Institute on Oct. 12 with Judy Michaels, the former president, to discuss Proposition 74, 75, and 76 and their effects on teachers. Mancina announced she received the report from AFT regarding the progress of full-time faculty.
- Hilary Thomas, CFCE, announced the executive council has approved a code of ethics and oath of office for officers. Thomas announced that the officers will be inducted at the general meeting on Oct. 13. Thomas also supports defeating Proposition 74, 75, and 76. Thomas expressed concern that there is no policy regarding re-organizations and encouraged the board to set a standard procedure.
- Bob Fey, Adjunct Union, ratified their contract with the District.

Student Government Organizations

- Todd Bowen, ASOCC President, stated the school's involvement in the Katrina Relief effort with the campus canned food drive. Bowen reported that the students are interested in AB982 and student health fees have supported the bill by writing letters to their congressional representatives. Bowen announced that OCC will host a Children's Book Festival on campus.
- Jeri Elder, President, Student Advisory Council, Coastline announced the Lids Save Lives Yoplait Yogurt campaign for breast cancer research is underway. Elder also discussed the celebration of Constitution Day which was on Sept. 17 and announced he will be attending the State Chancellor's Summit.

Academic Senate Organizations

- Nancy Jones, CCC Academic Senate President, commented on student conduct and the faculty hiring process. Jones plans on attending the Economic Workforce Advisory statewide.
- Kevin Parker, OCC Academic Senate President, reported that the opening day of Focus Day was a great success and they are working on an agenda for the upcoming year.
- Stephanie Dumont, GWC Academic Senate President, endorsed the student code of conduct and free speech policies from the District. Dumont announced that the new hire ranking process has been approved. A letter to all faculty and staff asking for donations to support the victims of Hurricane Katrina was distributed on campus. Dumont plans on attending the "California Tomorrow" conference to train for Campus Support Network.

After working 15 years in the business sector, Charlanne Nee began her career in 1974, in the Coast Community College District, in Orange Coast College's evening office. In 1976, Charlanne became a charter member of the Coastline Community College staff. She held the positions of Assistant Dean responsible for the Coastline Telecourse Support Office and Discipline and Site Dean of Business, International Studies and the Cooperative Work Experience Program. In the early 80's, she was awarded the first Outstanding Telecourse Administrator award from the Southern California Consortium for Telecourses. Charlanne was also responsible for the start-up of Coastline's first Distance Learning with military programs at Dover and Norton Air Force Bases. She served on the District International Studies Committee in the early 90's. In 1995, Charlanne was appointed Dean of the Business and Information Systems Division at Golden West College, where she has also been responsible for the college's Cooperative Work Experience and Contract Education Programs. Over the past 10 years, she has served on the Advisory Board for Ocean View High School's Business Academy. She has also served on numerous committees within the college and co-chaired the GWC Technology Committee for over five years. Charlanne began her academic endeavors at Los Angeles Valley College; earning an A.A. from Orange Coast College, a Bachelor's in Business Administration and Master's in Business Management from Redlands University, a second Master's in Counseling from Chapman University, and a Doctorate in Education from Pepperdine University. Like many of the District's students, Charlanne achieved her academic degrees on a part-time basis while she worked in a full-time career. In addition, she taught at Orange Coast College in the late 70's. After 31 years within the Coast Community College District and having worked on all three District campuses, Charlanne will be retiring December 30, 2005. She leaves behind many friends and acquaintances on each campus and in the District Office. Charlanne and her husband, Paul, plan to travel and visit family and friends throughout the U.S. and the world over the next few years. In between trips, she will work and relax in her garden.
