REPORTS

October 15, 2008

Board of Trustees

- Trustee Jim Moreno is very pleased with the Faculty House event with the OCC Academic Senate where he learned a lot about organization and process. Trustee Moreno attended a Green Summit and presented a report to the Board and the Chancellor on his experience. Last week, Trustee Moreno met with SOCCD Chancellor Raghu Mather to discuss using the Orange County Legislative Task Force as a vehicle to promote green technology.
- Trustee Mary Hornbuckle attended the OCC Athletic Hall of Fame induction and had a great time. Trustee Hornbuckle also attended the National Association of Women Business Owners "Remarkable Women Awards" to support GWC employee Noreen Yoshida-Peer.

Chancellor

- Ken Yglesias announced that the District is working to put together a Green Task Force to deal with sustainability issues and a strategic plan for the future.

Presidents

- Bob Dees, OCC President, announced the new OCC Spanish-language DVD to reach out to Latino students. Dees reported over the last three years OCC has experienced an increase in the number of Latino students and wants to continue that trend.
- Wes Bryan, GWC President, reported that the Doyle Pavilion will open up on November 19 and Friday the Boys and Girls Club of Huntington Valley will have the groundbreaking this Friday for their new facility on the GWC campus. GWC is hosting a community forum on November 12 and has invited the developers from Bella Terra to talk about community-wide impact. On October 22 there will be an all-campus safety drill.
- Ding-Jo Currie, CCC President, reported that everything at Coastline is going well. CCC hosted a townhall meeting with Congresswoman Sanchez and Senator Lou Correa to foster a partnership and outreach effort with the community.

Employee Representative Groups

- Barbara Price, President of the Part-Time Faculty Union, attended a fall conference in San Francisco. The CCCD had seven delegates this year and should have 10 next year, due to growth in the part time teachers. From the conference, the part-time faculty is looking at implementing some procedural changes. The keynote at the conference was John Chiang and Dr. Price was very impressed by him. Dr. Price is proud of the P/T union board, which is comprised of a student representative, a firefighter and five people with doctorates. In the future, the union will start featuring part-time teachers who have converted to full-timers.
- Dean Mancina, President of Coast Federation of Educators, announced that the MOU was approved by members to extend the current contract for another year with two re-openers.

- Kris Cutting, ASOCC, presented the Board and the audience with a packet of handouts on upcoming OCC events. The events include a debate between nominees for the 46th Congressional District and a CCCD Trustee Forum. Other events include a Science night and a debate night for the Debate Club.
