**REPORTS**

**November 7, 2007**

Board of Trustees

- Trustee Walt Howald attended the Association of General Contractor's Board of Director's meeting and was the only community college representative. He reported that he will encourage community colleges to become more involved in CTE programs. Many high school CTE programs are closed. Trustee Howald also attended the System Strategic Plan Implementation Oversight Committee.
- Student Trustee Paul Bunch attended the OCC Science Night and reported that it had a huge turnout. He also attended the Teacher of the Year banquet and said it was amazing and congratulated the teachers of the year from the District. He reported that he tried his MySite and it was working well. The District Student Council will meet on November 16.
- Trustee Mary Hornbuckle reported that GWC Courtyard of Honor and Measure C improvements were in full swing.
- Trustee Jim Moreno attended the OCLTF breakfast at Rancho Santiago where Senator Ackerman was recognized for his service to students. Commented that many issues will face our colleges this year and community colleges have an important role in providing public safety personnel. Reported that the city of Huntington Beach honored GWC's Criminal Justice Department for their scholarship program for returning Iraqi Veterans.
- Trustee Jerry Patterson said the computer-use policy will be on the November 19 agenda instead of tonight. Trustee Patterson also wants to discuss the shared governance issue and then suggested a workshop as a possible option.

Chancellor

- Ken Yglesias, Chancellor, talked about the Governor's proposed 10% budget cut and noted that the Governor may suspend Prop 98.

Presidents

- Bob Dees, OCC President, talked about the memorial for Doree Dunlap, the former Director of the Arts Pavilion. Bob attended the OC Teacher of the Year banquet and Terry Timmons was the teacher honored from OCC. He is charming the accreditation team and talked about his visit to Oxnard College.
- Ding-Jo Currie, CCC, President, congratulated Lisa Lee for being nominated as Teacher of the Year from CCC. Coastline's One-Stop in Irvine served as the first Local Assistance Shelter in Orange County to help with fire victims. Ding-Jo is very proud of Lois Wilkerson for acting as incident commander Coastline staff put in more than 500 hours of volunteer time.
- Wes Bryan, GWC President, congratulated Yvonne Valenzuela for being nominated as the Teacher of the Year from GWC. Wes also talked about construction swing space.

Employee Representative Groups

- Barbara Price, President of the CCA, wants to be sure that the part-time faculty is adequately trained in Banner. Barbara passed out the Advocate newspaper, which encourages the passage of Prop 92.

- Neal Kelsey, Executive Director CFCE, supports Prop 92.

Student Government Organizations

- Penny Mains, CCCSAC Vice President, CSAC is collecting pink Yoplait yogurt lids for the Lids for Life program, earning 10 cents per lid toward breast cancer research
- Golden West Representative, Tahnee Le, reported that the wildfires forced GWC to reschedule their Homecoming football game. This year's Homecoming King and Queen are Brandon Cook and Jocelyn Zecua. Le announced that students seem to be in favor of the smoking ban on campus. The ASGWC has taken no stance on Prop 92. The Angel Tree project is scheduled to start in December. Finally, she reported that GWC will host a blood drive on Nov 14 and 15 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Lynne Riddle, ASOCC President, reported that OCC is disappointed in the governor's refusal to sign both the DREAM act and the Textbook Accountability Act. The ASOCC passed resolution in support of Prop 92; Lynne thanked C.M. Brahmhatt for speaking to them about the issue.

Academic Senate Organizations

- CCC Academic Senate President Cheryl Stewart talked about a committee that combines matriculation, basic skills and equity committees in order to focus on student success. The Senate met with the Accreditation Committee, and will be a standing committee that addresses all accreditation issues to develop an ongoing commitment to accreditation. Several senators went to plenary meeting.
- GWC Academic Senate President, Stephanie Dumont, reported that the Student Success Committee is combining basic skills and matriculation. Stephanie attended the Senate Plenary Committee and participated in Operation Callback, which reaches out to students who are having issues with grades and/or attendance. GWC is considering a proposal that all students who obtain a degree be computer literate. GWC fall celebration is on November 27 from noon to 2 p.m. in the Humanities Lounge, there will be a silent auction and an opportunity drawing to benefit faculty members who lost homes in the wildfires.
- OCC Academic Senate President, George Monahan congratulated Cheryl and Stephanie on their presentations at the plenary session where the theme was 'change'.
