REPORTS

November 19, 2007

Board of Trustees

- Trustee Jim Moreno attended the Veteran's day activities on the Huntington Beach Pier on November 11 at 11:00 a.m., which represents Armistice Day. Trustee Moreno acknowledged the Criminal Justice scholarships at GWC for veterans. Trustee Moreno attended the Policy Academy graduation at the Rose Center.
- Trustee Mary Hornbuckle attended the Policy Academy graduation and noted it was moving and inspiring. Trustee Hornbuckle attended the Children's Center Thanksgiving lunch. Trustee Hornbuckle was a reader for the Newport Mesa Readers' Grants Dinner. She also reported that Leadership Tomorrow had an education forum with community college trustees and Newport Mesa Unified School District officials. Trustee Hornbuckle rejects comments about GWC.
- Trustee Armando Ruiz wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.
- Trustee Walt Howald concurred with Trustee Hornbuckle's comments, but has no position on Costco Proposal. Trustee Howald attended the Art Center student event, and said the students had fun explaining their projects. Trustee Howald went to San Jose for the CC League conference and made several presentations.
- Student Trustee Paul Bunch reported that the District Student Council passed two resolutions at their meeting last Friday. Bunch commented on the new District office and wants it to be environmentally friendly.

Chancellor

- Ken Yglesias, Chancellor, acknowledged Trustee Moreno for helping with the Criminal Justice scholarships for veterans at GWC. Dr. Yglesias reported that CCCD is #1 for Prop 92 fundraising, reaching 107% of their total goal. The Chancellor gave a Project Voyager update, a Measure C update, an update on the HR negotiations, a PR update, a report on 1A and reassured everyone that all of the campus's fire alarms are working.
