COAST COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT'S RESPONSE TO KOCE-TV SETTLEMENT

Following the Coast Community College District's Board of Trustees' meeting on June 20, 2007, Jerry Patterson, President of the District's Board of Trustees reported that the District has been informed that KOCE-TV Foundation and Word of God Fellowship, Inc. ("Daystar") have reached a full settlement on the issues surrounding the sale of KOCE-TV by the Coast Community College District to the KOCE-TV Foundation. The terms of the settlement between the KOCE-TV Foundation and Daystar provide that all existing litigation between all parties shall be dismissed by Daystar.

President Patterson stated "The Coast Community College District Board is pleased to learn that this settlement will allow the KOCE-TV Foundation to retain the station license so that it can continue to serve the public's interest by providing quality PBS and educational television to our community."

Board Vice-President Armando Ruiz expressed his satisfaction that a full settlement between the KOCE-TV Foundation and Daystar had been reached. Mr. Ruiz commented that "the Coast Community College District can now focus its full efforts on our core mission; that of providing quality instruction to our students."
